The USGA has extended an invitation to the children of the Shinnecock Indian Nation to participate in the "junior golf day" on June 15 and they will also be donating hundreds of golf balls to support the development of the Shinnecock youth golf program. The USGA also announced that it will provide the tribe with useful resources upon the conclusion of the event such as wood, stairs, carpet and gravel.

It is a sign of respect and a solid relationship between the USGA and the Shinnecock Nation.
